HELPING CHILDREN DEVELOP SELF-DISCIPLINE

Children's behavior can be frustrating, manipulating and exhausting. Behavior is learned, so it is up to the adults to teach them. Children are like sponges, they imitate and often model what adults do, so providing appropriate and clear guidelines will help them respect those boundaries. If an adult for instance, bites a child to stop them from biting, the child thinks that biting is ok. Children really thrive on boundaries. They need them and do better if they have these boundaries at home and school.

- 1) Be clear and consistent. Set and discuss rules and consequences. Rules should be clear, simple and few.
- 2) Offer choices. "Do you want to put your pj's on now or after we read a story?"
- 3) Ignore certain behavior, pick your battles! Give them enough control so they can be independent, but be clear if they break a rule. Do not negotiate! They will take a mile if you make open-ended threats.

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
